

Factory-Welded Joints

Installation Instructions for Pulling and Supporting Factory-Welded Joints



DESCRIPTION

Pyrotenax Factory-Welded Joints are supplied when the circuit length exceeds the nominal coil length of a particular cable configuration. Reinforcing sleeves are affixed at both ends of every joint to avoid damage to the welds when the cable is pulled into position. Factory-welded Joints for fire-rated applications have been tested to UL 2196 and ULC-S139 and carry a 2-hour fire rating that requires no additional protection.

Note: For fire-rated applications, Factory-Welded Joints are only available for cable diameters of 0.402 in (10.2 mm) and larger.



Pulling the Joint

Do not pull the joint over a pulley or sheave.
 Manually pass the cable with the joint beyond the
 pulley/sheave first, taking care not to bend the
 cable at the joint ends. Bend the cable around the
 pulley/sheave, by hand, and continue pulling once
 the joint is past the pulley/sheave.


Important: To avoid damaging the joint, do not pull the joint directly over a sheave or pulley.



Fastening the Joint

When fastening the joint to a wall or ceiling, support the
joint using the banding and bracket system available from
Chemelex. Further details on the banding and bracket
system, and support spacing for the cable on either side of
the joint, can be found in the Commercial MI Wiring Cable
Installation Manual (H58764). The joint must be supported
at its center and 39 in (1 m) on either side of this support as
shown below.

 When using any other method to support fire-rated cables, such as a trapeze system, stagger the joints if possible and ensure that each joint is firmly supported. This can be accomplished by supporting each joint with additional trapeze supports or by securing the joint on top of a section of steel channel and firmly attaching the channel between existing trapeze supports.



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
